As you prepare for the test, please do the following things:

## 1. DOWNLOAD AND PRINT YOUR TEST VOUCHER.

The voucher is posted on the JLPT registration website, <a href="https://jlpt.us">https://jlpt.us</a>. Log in with the email address and password you used when you registered for the test, and click on the red button to download the voucher. Do not print the Voucher on the back of reused paper or other paper that has writing on it.

\*\*Bring THE VOUCHER AND YOUR PHOTO ID to the test site on December 1.\*\*
Any government-issued photo ID is acceptable. In lieu of this we can accept school and work IDs. If a minor doesn't have an ID, verification from a parent is sufficient.

## 2. READ THE TEST SITE INFORMATION.

A PDF file containing detailed information on the location of your test site (including a map and directions), the schedule, and a list of what to bring (and not to bring) has been posted online at <a href="https://www.aatj.org/jlpt-us">https://www.aatj.org/jlpt-us</a>. Please scroll down to your test site location and click on the link in the third column to "2024 Test Site Information".

## 3. REVIEW THE INSTRUCTIONS FOR COVID-19 SAFETY AT YOUR TEST SITE.

You must comply with safety measures like mask wearing, social distancing, and any others that have been put in place at the test site.

- Please access the campus **ONLY from Gate 1**. You will be asked to show your ID. Please check in between 11:30am-12:00pm.
- Only test takers are allowed on campus. Guests who accompany you to the test site are not allowed on campus.
- Once you are on campus, report to your assigned classroom in Carman Hall during the scheduled reporting time. You must present your <u>admission voucher (print out)</u>, proper <u>photo identification</u> to a proctor in order to be allowed into the classroom.
