 Since the test takes place during winter when severe weather could affect roads and public transportation, please make sure you allow extra time to reach the test site as well as to return to your destination.

General Testing Guidelines:

- Plan to dress so that you can adapt to any room temperature. DO NOT wear any clothing with visible Japanese writing.
- Guests who accompany you to the test center are not allowed in the classroom.
- You are not allowed to leave the test room until a proctor dismisses you. If you get sick during
 the test and must leave the room, you must notify the proctor so that the proctor can
 accompany you out of the room.

What to Bring to the Test Site:

You **MUST** bring the following items:

- 1. Your **test voucher printed on a blank paper**. Electronic copies presented on mobile devices cannot be used during the test and will NOT be accepted.
- 2. A **valid photo ID**. Copies are not accepted.
 - Acceptable forms of ID include driver's license, state ID, or passport. Your ID must display
 your full name, photo, and date of birth. If you are a minor without another form of ID, a
 student ID without your date of birth is acceptable. Social security cards, credit or ATM
 cards, and retail credit cards are not acceptable.
 - The first and last name on your voucher must match the name on your official ID.
 - It is your responsibility to ensure that your official ID is valid (not expired) and available on the day of the test.
 - ID checks are strictly enforced. If you arrive at the test center without a valid ID, you will not be permitted to take the test.
- 3. Several sharpened No. 2 or HB **pencils** and an **eraser** for the multiple-choice answer sheets. Pencils and erasers will not be supplied at the test center. Pens are NOT permitted. Mechanical pencils are allowed but not recommended as they may hinder machine-grading.

Prohibited Materials during the Exam:

- 1. Electronic equipment including:
 - cell phones of any kind
 - digital watches, any devices that can record, transmit, or receive information
 - personal computing devices
 - Bluetooth devices such as wireless earbuds/headphones, or tablets
 - Cameras
 - audio players/recorders
 - All devices described above must be completely turned off and stored in your bag under your seat during the test.
 - If your device makes any noise or vibrates, you are disqualified. If this happens, please follow the proctor's instructions, even if it is an accident. Your test score will be voided and you will not receive a score for the test.
- 2. Handwritten or printed materials.
 - cheat sheets written on paper, Japanese characters on skin, clothing and personal belongings.

3. Food or drink: You may bring small snacks and drinks to the test site and consume them outside of the exam room during breaks. Eating and drinking during the examination is only permitted for examinees who have special accommodation permission applied in advance.

Note:

Your personal bag must fit under your seat and should not block any walkways.

By Car

Middlebury College is located in west-central Vermont in the town of Middlebury. The town of Middlebury is a 2 1/2 hour drive from Montreal, about 4 hours from both Boston and Hartford, 5 hours from New York City, and 6 1/2 hours from Philadelphia.

If you're using a GPS app on your smartphone, please enter the destination address as <u>287</u> <u>Bicentennial Way, Middlebury, VT 05753</u>.

From Burlington International Airport

Coming out of the airport turn left on Airport Road. At the stop light, cross the intersection onto Kennedy Drive. At the second light enter Rt. 189, (West to Rt. 7). At intersection of Rt. 7 turn left and continue south to Middlebury (30 miles). At the large white Congregational Church turn right, continue through town bearing right onto Rt. 125; Go past St. Mary's Church and the College is on the left.

From New York

I-87 (Northway) North to Exit 20. Go east on Rt. 149 (Glens Falls area) to Rt. 4 (Whitehall, NY) to Vermont. At Exit 4 (Castleton, VT take Rt. 30 North to Middlebury.

From Connecticut

I-91 North to Springfield/Ludlow VT Exit. Then take Rt. 103 to Rt. 7 (Rutland) and go North on Rt. 7 to Middlebury.

From Maine

I-95 South to Exeter, NH. Take Rt. 101 West to Concord, NH. Take I-93 North to I-89 North into Vermont. At Queechee, VT (Exit 1) take Rt. 4 west to Rt. 7(Rutland). Then North on Rt. 7 to Middlebury.

From Eastern Massachusetts

I-93 North to I-89 North into Vermont. Take Exit 1(Queechee) to Rt. 4 West ot Rt. 7 North to Middlebury.

Or

Stay on I-89 to North Bethel, VT (Exit 3). Take Rt. 107 West to 100 North to 125 West (over Middlebury Mountain) to Middlebury.

From Central Massachusetts

I-91 North to Springfield/Ludlow, Vt Exit. Take Rt. 103 to Rt. 7 North (Rutland) then North on Rt. 7 to Middlebury.

From Western Massachusetts

At Pittsfield, MA take Rt. 7 North to Middlebury

By Public Transportation

Vermont Translines operates a bus route from Albany, NY, to Burlington, VT, with a stop in the town of Middlebury. You can use this bus when traveling from downtown Burlington to Middlebury. For more information, please see the website:


